A woman who spends all her time complaining soon finds her complaints coming true. (check www.amazon.com for used copies)

Cohen, Barbara. *Molly's Pilgrim.* Illus. Michael J. Deraney. New York: Harper Collins, 1998 (revised edition). ISBN: 0688162797. \$15.95; \$3.99 (pbk.). Grades 2-5.

Told to make a doll like a Pilgrim for the Thanksgiving display at school, Molly's Jewish mother dresses the doll as she herself dressed before leaving Russia to seek religious freedom -- much to Molly's embarrassment. The sequel is *Make A Wish Molly* (1994) and both are also available on VHS. See also *A Guide for Using Molly's Pilgrim in the Classroom* by Susan Kilpatrick (1995).

Cooks, Roberta Goldshlag. *Gittel and the Bell.* Illus. Susan Martz. Rockville, MD: Kar-Ben Copies, 1987. ISBN: 0930494687. OUT OF PRINT. Kindergarten-Grade 2.

Since everyone scolded eight-year-old Gittel in the past for ringing the town bell on unimportant occasions, she is not sure what to do when she finds their missing Torah. (check www.amazon.com for used copies)

Benny loves to help out at his grandpa's bakery. And the customers love Grandpa's bagels. One day, Grandpa explains to Benny that God, not him, should be thanked for the wonderful bagels. Benny thinks it's a good idea. But how do you thank God? See also *Bone Button Borscht* (1995).

Yossi's terrible tumble turns out to be a terrific triumph . . . and a possible explanation for why Jews eat round *challot* on Rosh Hashanah!

Getzel. *The Stonecutter Who Wanted To Be Rich.* New York: C.I.S. Publishers, 1990. ISBN: 156062030. OUT OF PRINT. Early Childhood-Grade 1.

A simple illustration of the Pirkei Avot: "Who is rich? One who is satisfied with what he has." Combine with *Chicken Man* by Michelle Edwards (1991) and *I Wish I Were a Butterfly* by James Howe (1987) for a perfect lesson in being happy with who you are.

In this retelling of a traditional Jewish folktale, Joseph's baby blanket is transformed into ever smaller items as he grows until there is nothing left--but then Joseph has an idea. Use with *Joseph Had a Little Overcoat* by Simms Taback (2000), *Bit by Bit* by Steve Sanfield (1995), and *'Til the Cows Come Home* by Jodi Icenoggle (2004) along with the song "I Had An Old Coat" by Sharon, Lois & Bram on the *Elephant Party* CD.

Goldin, Barbara Diamond. *A Mountain of Blintzes*. Illus. Anik McGrory. San Diego: Harcourt, 2001. ISBN: 0152019022. \$16.00. PK-Grade 2.

A family works together to gather the necessary ingredients to make blintzes for Shavuot. See also: *Just Enough Is Plenty: A Hanukkah Tale* (1988), *The World's Birthday: A Rosh Hashanah Story* (Sydney Taylor Honor Award 1990), *Cakes and Miracles: A Purim Tale* (Sydney Taylor Award Winner 1991), *The Magician's Visit: A Passover Tale* (1993), *Night Lights: A Sukkot Story* (1995, 2002), *While the Candles Burn: Eight Stories for Hanukkah* (1996), *Journeys With Elijah: Eight Tales of the Prophet* (Sydney Taylor Honor Award 1999), and *101 Jewish Read-Aloud Stories: Ten-Minute Readings from the World's Best-Loved Jewish Literature* (2001).

Dark clouds gather as Yessa walks to her brother's place, telling a story as she goes about the early days of the earth; and the animals follow her two by two to listen. A great introduction to the concept of midrash. (check www.amazon.com for used copies)

Hirsh, Marilyn. *The Rabbi and the Twenty-Nine Witches*. New York: Scholastic Inc., 1986. ISBN: 059040735X. OUT OF PRINT. Kindergarten-Grade 3.

A wise old rabbi finally rids the village of witches that terrorize it every night that the moon is full. (check www.amazon.com for used copies) See also: *Could Anything Be Worse?* (1974), *The House on the Roof: A Sukkot Story* (1976), and *Joseph Who Loved the Sabbath* (1986).

Howland, Naomi. *Matzah Man*. New York: Clarion/Houghton Mifflin, 2002. ISBN: 061811750. \$15.00. Preschool – Grade 1.

"Hot from the oven I jumped and ran, so clever and quick, I'm the Matzah Man!" Sprightly illustrations show all of the action in this Passover version of "The Gingerbread Boy." *The Runaway Latkes* by Leslie Kimmelman (2000) is another cute Jewish "Gingerbread" story. See also *Latkes, Latkes, Good to Eat* (1999).

Jules, Jacqueline. *Once Upon a Shabbos*. Illus. Katherine Janus Kahn. Rockville, MD: Kar-Ben Copies, 1998. ISBN: 1580130216. \$6.95 (pbk.) Early Childhood-Grade 1.

A bear keeps taking the honey needed for the Shabbos kugel, until Grandma learns that he is lost and invited him to come to dinner.

Kimmel, Eric A. *Zigazak! A Magical Hanukkah Night*. Illus. Jon Goodell. New York: Doubleday Book for Young Readers, 2001. ISBN: 0385326521. \$15.95. Kindergarten-Grade 3.

Two evil spirits wreck havoc on the town of Brisk's Hanukkah celebration, until the town's wise rabbi puts a stop to their mischief. See also: *The Chanukah Guest* (Sydney Taylor Award Winner 1988), *The Magic Dreidels* (1996), *When Mindy Saved Hanukkah* (1998), *The Jar of Fools: Eight Hanukkah Stories from Chelm* (2000), and *A Cloak for the Moon* (Sydney Taylor Honor Winner 2001)

When his sins threaten the lives of his beloved twin children, a Jewish man finally repents of his wicked ways.

A cumulative rhyme in the style of "The House That Jack Built" describes the traditions connected to a family's celebration of the Passover Seder. See also *Latkes and Applesauce: A Hanukkah Story* (1989), *Starlight and Candles: The Joys of the Sabbath* (1995), *Come, Let Us Be Joyful The Story of Hava Nagila* (2000), *Sophie and the Shofar: A New Year's Story* (2001), and *Hooray for Hanukkah!* (2001).

A retelling of the traditional tale about a bee that repays King Solomon's mercy by helping him solve the Queen of Sheba's riddle. (check www.amazon.com for used copies)

Retells the story of two brothers, who after years of sharing everything, become angry enough to lose control and bring violence into the world. A Jewish version of the Cinderella story, in which a poor, but educated young woman captivates her "Prince Charming" a rabbi's son, at a Purim ball. Combine with *The Way Meat Loves Salt: A Cinderella Tale from the Jewish Tradition* by Nina Jaffe (1998). See also: *Gittel's Hands* (1996) and *When the Chickens Went on Strike* (Sydney Taylor Honor Winner 2003).

In this variation of "The House That Jack Built," a little boy smugly relates how he is doing all the building of the sukkah while his bemused family looks on.

A wise rabbi doles out surprising advice to a man complaining of overcrowded quarters in this Yiddish folktale; Zemach's exuberantly chaotic illustrations earned her a Caldecott Honor in 1978. Combine with *Could Anything Be Worse?* by Marilyn Hirsh (1974), *The Rabbi's Wisdom* by Erica Gordon (1991), *A Big Quiet House* by Heather Forest (1996) and *Terrible, Terrible!* by Robin Bernstein (1998).

During a rare day of snow in Jerusalem, a Jewish boy and an Arab boy who live in the Old City experience a rare moment of friendship when they put aside their differences to help a stray cat. Ethereal watercolor and pencil drawings portray the earthly and the heavenly Jerusalem.

Deedy, Carmen Agra. *The Yellow Star: The Legend of King Christian X of Denmark*. Illus. Henry Sorensen. Atlanta: Peachtree, 2000. ISBN: 1561452084. \$16.95. Grades 3-5.

A beautifully illustrated tribute to the tolerance of the Danish people and their king, who took many risks on behalf of the Jewish population during the German occupation of World War II.

*** Fagan, Cary. *The Market Wedding*. Illus. by Regolo Ricci. Plattsburgh, NY: Tundra Books of Northern New York, 2000. ISBN: 0887764924. \$16.95. Grades 1-3.**

A fishmonger falls in love with the milliner whose cart is across the street from his in the turn-of-the-century Kensington Market, and even though his plan for a fine wedding backfires, all ends well.

Hartt-Snowbell, Sarah. *Yesterday's Santa and the Chanukah Miracle*. Illus. Patty Gallinger. Toronto: Napoleon Publishing, 2002. ISBN: 0929141148. \$10.95 (pbk.) Grades 1-3.

Annie can't believe her eyes! The Santa in the mall looks so much like her grandfather's friend, Simon. A Jewish Santa? Annie lines up to get a closer look. This is a holiday story of acceptance, religious freedom, and the act of giving.

Herman, Charlotte. *How Yussel Caught the Gefilte Fish*. Illus. Katya Krenina. New York: Dutton Children's Books, 1999. ISBN: 0525454497. OUT OF PRINT. Kindergarten-Grade 2.

When he goes fishing with his father for the first time, a young boy hopes to catch the gefilte fish for his family's Shabbat dinner, but instead he catches a carp, a trout, and a pike. (check www.amazon.com for used copies)

*** Hest, Amy. *When Jessie Came Across the Sea*. Illus. by P.J. Lynch. Cambridge, MA: Candlewick Press, 1997. ISBN: 076361274X. \$16.99; \$6.99 (pbk.) Kindergarten-Grade 3.**

A thirteen-year-old Jewish orphan reluctantly leaves her grandmother and immigrates to New York City, where she works for three years sewing lace and earning money to bring Grandmother to the United States, too. See also *Love You Soldier* (1991 and Sydney Taylor Honor Award 2000), *The Private Notebook of Katie Roberts, Age 11* (1995), *The Great Green Notebook of Katie Roberts Who Just Turned 12 on Monday* (1998), and *The Friday Nights of Nana* (2001).

Explains eleven major Jewish holidays and how they are celebrated. The explanation of Yom Hashoah is particularly powerful and exceptionally well-written.

Kushner, Lawrence and Karen. *Because Nothing Looks Like God*. Illus. Dawn W. Majewski. Woodstock, VT: Jewish Lights Publishing, 2000. ISBN: 158023092X. \$16.95. Early Childhood – Grade 3.

Mixing sparks of curiosity and spiritual imagination, this wondrous book lights children's creativity and shows how God is with us everyday, in every way. Also published as three board books: *What Does God Look Like?*, *How Does God Make Things Happen?*, and *Where Is God?*

Lasky, Kathryn. *Marven of the Great North Woods*. Illus. Kevin Hawkes. San Diego, CA: Harcourt Brace & Company, 1997. ISBN: 0152001042. \$16.00; \$7.00 (pbk.) Grades 2-4.

When his Jewish parents send him to a Minnesota logging camp to escape the influenza epidemic of 1918, ten-year-old Marven finds a special friend.

A biography of a Czech girl who died in the Holocaust, told in alternating chapters with an account of how the curator of a Japanese Holocaust center learned about her life after Hana's suitcase was sent to her.

Manushkin, Fran. *Miriam's Cup*. Illus. Bob Dacey. New York: Scholastic Press, 1998. ISBN: 0590677209. \$15.95. Kindergarten-Grade 3.

A Jewish mother preparing for Passover tells her children the story of Miriam, the biblical woman who prophesied the birth of Moses. See also *Daughters of Fire: Heroines of the Bible* (2001).

McCann, Michelle. *Luba: The Angel of Bergen-Belsen*. Illus. Ann Marshall. Berkeley, CA: Tricycle Press, 2003. ISBN: 1582460981. \$16.95. Grades 3-5.

A biography of the Jewish heroine, Luba Trzszynska, who saved the lives of more than fifty Jewish children in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp during the winter of 1944-1945.

When the Queen of Sheba, the wisest woman in the world, comes to Jerusalem to present an unusual request to King Solomon, the wisest man in the world, the fate of every bird in the world is at stake.

A homemade quilt ties together the lives of four generations of an immigrant Jewish family, remaining a symbol of their enduring love and faith. After the German occupation of the Netherlands, Benjamin leaves the Christian family with whom he had been living and is reunited with his real Jewish parents who returned from hiding and whom Benjamin doesn't remember.

Rael, Elsa Okon. *What Zeesie Saw on Delaney Street*. Illus. Marjorie Priceman. New York: Simon & Schuster Books for Young Readers, 1996. ISBN: 0689805497. \$16.00; \$6.99 (pbk.) Grades 1-5.

A young Jewish girl living on Manhattan's Lower East Side attends her first "package party" where she learns about the traditions of generosity, courage, and community among Jewish immigrants in the early 1900s. See also *When Zaydeh Danced on Eldridge Street* (Sydney Taylor Award Winner 1997) and *Rivka's First Thanksgiving* (Sydney Taylor Award Winner 2001).

Rosen, Michael J. *Chanukah Lights Everywhere*. Illus. Melissa Iwai. San Diego: Harcourt, 2001. ISBN: 0152024476. \$16.00. Early Childhood – Grade 2.

A young boy counts the candles on the family menorah and the lights he sees in the world around him on each night of Hanukkah. See also: *Elijah's Angel: A Story for Chanukah and Christmas* (1992), *A Thanksgiving Wish* (1998), and *Our Eight Nights of Hanukkah* (2000).

☆ **Schur, Maxine. *The Peddler's Gift*. Illus. Kimberly Bulcken Root. New York: Dial Books for Young Readers, 1999. ISBN: 0803719787. OUT OF PRINT. Kindergarten-Grade 2.**

A young boy in turn-of-the-century rural Russia learns that appearances are often deceiving after he steals and then tries to return a dreidel to the traveling peddler. See also *Day of Delight: A Jewish Sabbath in Ethiopia* (1994) and *When I Left My Village* (Sydney Taylor Award Winner 1996).

After being moved from Yugoslavia to a refugee camp in New York during World War II, one Jewish boy is befriended by a local girl, but when their special friendship turns to romance, their parents demand they end the relationship.

Bell, William. *Zack*. New York: Simon & Schuster Books for Young Readers, 1999. ISBN: 0689825293. \$4.99 (pbk.) Grades 7-10.

The son of a Jewish father and black mother, high school senior Zack has never been allowed to meet his mother's family, but after doing a research project on a former slave, he travels from his home in Canada to Natchez, Mississippi to find his grandfather.

After suffering a concussion while on a class trip to a Holocaust exhibit, Nicole finds herself living the life of a Jewish teenager in Paris during the Nazi occupation.
