Chwast, Seymour. *Had Gadya: A Passover Song*. Roaring Brook Press, 2005. Bright, simple illustrations add depth and beauty to this picture book version of the traditional song. For preschool - primary.

Pearlman, Bobby. *Passover Is Here!* Illus. by Christel Desmoinaux. Little Simon, 2005. Lift the flaps for a brightly colored introduction to Passover. For preschool - Kindergarten.

Rappaport, Doreen. *The Secret Seder*. Illus. by Emily Arnold McCully. Hyperion, 2005. Outstanding illustrations illuminate this inspiring story about a Seder held during the Holocaust. Gr. 4 - 6.

Rush, Barbara. *Passover Splendor*. Stewart, Tabori and Chang, 2005. Sixty color photographs of Haggadot, Seder plates, wine cups, and textiles are showcased in this handsome book. For middle school, high school, and adult.

Sasso, Sandy. *Abuelita's Secret Matzah*. Illus. by Diane Bryer. Emmis Books, 2005. Jacobo learns his family's secret after attending a friend's Passover Seder. A nicely illustrated story about crypto-Jews in New Mexico. For grades 2 - 5.

Shulman, Lisa. *Matzo Ball Boy*. Illus. by Rosanne Litzinger. Dutton, 2005. A mischievous version of the Gingerbread Boy, set during Passover. Preschool - Gr. 2

Sollish, Ari. *A Touch of Passover*. Illus. by Boruch Becker. Merkos L'Inyonei Chinuch, 2004. A very easy touch and feel book for toddlers and preschoolers. There is also a version in Spanish.
